## **Getting Back to Basics - Agriculture Workshop Series**

Murray LLS Sustainable Agriculture team is hosting a series of workshops across the region throughout May and June with well renowned technical experts including Jim Shovelton, Sue Briggs, Phil Graham and Paul Blackshaw.

A total of thirteen workshops will be held at various locations with each focussing on one of three themes:

- grazing management and animal nutrition
- soil fertility and pasture species selection
- farm business management basics.

## **African Boxthorn Removal Program**

#### **Expressions of Interest Open**

Western Murray Land Improvement Group African Boxthorn Removal Program Eligibility Area Map Western Murray Land Improvement Group successfully received funding from the Australian Government's Murray-Darling Healthy Rivers Program to complete an African Boxthorn Removal Program.

This cross-border project between NSW and VIC will directly improve the health of floodplain habitat along the Murray River benefiting the aquatic ecosystems in the river itself and nearby wetland habitat.

Expressions of interest are now open for landholders in the eligibility area to undertake African Boxthorn Control on their property.

## Landcare-led Landscape Resilience

#### Tools and data for restoration decisions

Holbrook Landcare in partnership with Murrumbidgee Landcare successfully gained funding through the Australian Government's Future Drought Fund in 2022, to deliver the Landcare-led Landscape Resilience Project. The project involves: updating the South-West Slopes and Riverina Revegetation Guides; developing a local network of trial and demonstration sites; and establishing an Environmental Markets community of practice for Landcarers and farming communities to drive farm business resilience.

#### **Revegetation Forum**

A Revegetation Forum was held in Wagga during December last year which brought together over 70 practitioners from across the catchment.

Discussions included: opportunities to build on positive experiences and lessons from the past, through sharing knowledge and experience; best practice approaches and principles to steer the update and development of key revegetation guides; and principles to guide the selection and establishment of trial sites and identify potential trial sites across the region.

A report has been written which details key outcomes and messages from the forum, with one being the need for more First Nations knowledge and language around vegetation.

#### **Demonstration Sites**

The project steering group has been working on the first round of demonstration sites that will be established this season and will focus on addressing: species choice for shrub longevity; how to establish shrubs in tree-dominated plantings; experimenting with planting density to overcome Phalaris dominance; improving biodiversity value in thick Cypress Pine regrowth; and scalping and ground layer grass and forb establishment.

#### **Community of Practice**

With Murray Local Land Services, Holbrook Landcare and Murrumbidgee Landcare have established a community of practice on Environmental Markets. This involves an online catchup for 1.5hrs every 6 weeks or so to talk about a topic of interest and share experiences.


