# **Murray Natural Resource Management Strategy Released**

Murray Local Land Services (LLS) has recently published the Murray Regional Natural Resource Management Strategy 2023-2028.

The purpose of this strategy is to:

- 1. Identify priority activities to protect the natural values of the Murray region.
- Provide a link of priority activities to the Australian Government's matters of national environmental significance.
- Provide strategic and practical guidance to Murray LLS in the implementation of its regional NRM program.

This document provides an overview of the development and implementation of the organisations Natural Resource Management (NRM) priority activities over the next 5 years.
